***Confession***

we have sinned against you

through negligence, through weakness,  
through our own deliberate fault.**

**We are truly sorry  
and repent of all our sins.  
For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ,  
who died for us,  
forgive us all that is past  
and grant that we may serve you in newness of life  
to the glory of your name.  
Amen.**

Listen to what the Bible says: 'If we claim to be without sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness.'  
1 John 1.8-9

***Collect***

**Merciful Lord, you know our struggle to serve you:  
when sin spoils our lives and overshadows our hearts,  
come to our aid and turn us back to you again;  
through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.**

**they sing praise to you,  
they sing the praises of your name.'**

**Prayers**

***Cast all your anxiety on him because he cares for you.***

1 Peter 5.7
