

# SERMON NOTES Sunday 19th April sunnysidechurch

**Bible passages Acts 2.14a, 22-32; John 20.19-end**

## Introduction

- Thomas: one of 12 disciples
- John 11: Thomas says 'Let us also go, that we might die with him'
- John 14: Thomas asks, 'Lord we don't know where you are going, so how can we know the way?'
- John 20: Thomas meets the risen Lord and responds by saying 'My Lord and my God!'

## Questions

- Nothing wrong with questions, they do not mean that we lack faith
- Need to be honest are they real questions or ways of deflecting or deriding?
- John 20.27 Greek says 'do not become faithless but faithful'
- Need to recognise that we won't have the answer to many questions in this life
- Answers to questions may not actually be what we need: Thomas really needed God's peace

## Meeting Jesus is what makes the difference

- Through Bible
- Through testimony of others (e.g. Peter in Acts)
- Through Holy Spirit in us and others

## Conclusion

- 'I do believe; help me overcome my unbelief' (Mark 9.24)

## Some questions for discussion

1. What questions would you like to ask God?
2. Read John 20.19-end. What strikes you about this story?
3. Rebecca said that Thomas thought he needed answers but what he needed was Jesus' peace. Do you agree?
4. How might questions help us become faithless or faithful?
5. In what ways did meeting with Jesus make the difference to the disciples including Thomas?
6. How did you first meet Jesus? In what ways do you meet with Jesus today?
7. The father said: 'I do believe; help me overcome my unbelief'. (Mark 9.24) Do you relate to this?
8. What is God asking you to do as a result of what he has said to you through these passages? It might be something to pray about, something to think more about, something he wants you to talk to someone about or something he wants you to do. Make a note of it so you don't forget!

'Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you.

I do not give to you as the world gives.

Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid.'

John 14.27

Why not spend some time asking the Holy Spirit to fill you with the peace of Christ and a sense of Jesus' presence? What does Jesus want to say to you?
